WHAT IS BULLYING?

Signs of Bullying	A child may:
	Tell an adult
	Act differently <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Not sleeping • Bad dreams • Unusually quiet
	Not want to come to school
	Say they feel poorly

	Staff will:
	Always listen to the child and their concerns
	Listen to parent/carers concerns however small they seem
	Act quickly and follow procedures.
	Safeguarding procedures will be carried out to keep pupils safe

School will:

Continue to encourage every pupil to follow school rules



Reward pupils for good behaviour



If bullying arises:

Support the children involved.
The child being bullied and the child who has been identified as being the 'bully' will both be provided with personalised support.



Parents can:

If you suspect that your child is being bullied:

- Inform your child's class teacher.
- They will address the issue and keep you updated with what is happening.
