Public Health

Illness in school - The North East Health Protection Team have been made aware that we have had a large number of children off school this week with illness.

PLEASE CAN I ASK YOU TO KEEP YOUR CHILD OFF SCHOOL IF THEY ARE UNWELL OR SHOW THE SIGNS OF THE FOLLOWING SYMPTOMS BELOW. THIS WILL HELP TO MINIMISE THE SPREAD OF INFECTION. THANK YOU.

Symptoms include fever, sore throat, abdominal pain, nausea and vomiting.

Viruses including influenza (flu) and norovirus can present with symptoms such as these and are a common cause of illness at this time of year in the community and in schools.

Influenza (flu) - Flu and flu-like viruses spread easily between people from coughs and sneezes. They can live on hands and surface for up to 24 hours. Symptoms of flu may develop quickly and can include:

Sudden fever - Dry, chesty cough - Sore throat - Aching body — Headache — Tiredness - Diarrhoea or tummy pain - Nausea

For most healthy people flu is an unpleasant but self-limiting illness. However, some people can be more at risk of developing severe illness or complications including the following groups:

Viral gastrointestinal illnesses - It is not uncommon for viruses which cause vomiting and diarrhoea to circulate among children (for example norovirus, also known as the 'winter vomiting bug'). If you child

develops vomiting or diarrhoea, it is important that they stay off school until 48 hours after they last vomited or passed diarrhoea. As always, please contact your GP or NHS 111 if you are concerned or need further advice on how to manage an illness.

General Hygiene - The spread of most infectious illnesses is reduced through good hand hygiene. Please encourage your child to wash their hands frequently with warm water and soap, particularly after using the toilet, after using a tissue to catch a cough or sneeze, and before eating.


I will be here to provide support for any child or parent that has any concerns or worries, and I will do my best to help in any way that I can.

Spirit of Christmas

You may have seen in the press or social media the letter sent to parents by a local teacher regarding Christmas presents.



At Front Street we would like to propose something similar. We always appreciate your generosity but wondered if you would help donate as the flyer below suggests.

Could you help us change a life this Christmas?

This Christmas we're asking people in our local community to support our Reverse Advent Calendar campaign and we're inviting your pupils to get involved!

Reverse Advent Calendar is an easy way to do something wonderful for someone else this Christmas and will be sure to capture the imagination of your pupils by introducing them to the joy of giving. It is a gentle way to start a conversation about social disadvantage and exclusion in our community, whilst showing that we all have the power to make change happen through small acts of kindness.

Instead of a traditional advent calendar where you open a door each day (and usually receive something in return) the Reverse Advent Calendar works by donating an item every day for a month. If you want to make your countdown to Christmas meaningful, all you need to do is find a big box for each class taking part and ask each pupil to bring in a different item from our enclosed wish list each day to place in the box.

All donations will be distributed to our projects across the North East, helping to make Christmas special for the individuals and families we support. Last year, many children also included festive drawings, cards and letters with messages of hope and good wishes, which were hugely appreciated by those who received them. Often, these are the only gifts the people we support will receive, so they really do make a big difference during the festive period, which can be an isolating time for those without somewhere to go this Christmas.
