#### A Letter from The Minister of State for Schools

The Rt Hon Nick Gibb wrote to me this week congratulating Front Street on the outstanding achievement in the 2019 Phonic Screening Check. Well Done to everybody involved. We are very proud. See the full letter below.



On Sunday some of our children are taking part in the Remembrance Parade in Whickham. They will need to wear full school uniform and a poppy. We are meeting at The Square at 10:15am, you will then collect your child from the Cenotaph at 11:15am. Two of Year 6 pupils will lay the wreath on behalf of Front Street and another will be reading a short message. It is a privilege to be part of this important event.

## Next Friday 15th November

It is Children in Need next Friday. Children will wear normal school uniform, but may wear Children in Need headbands, badges, Deeley Boppers etc. for a small donation.

Anti-Bullying Week - It is also Anti-Bullying week next week where the theme is 'Change Starts With Us'... Small change - Big difference.

#### **Pantomime**



Operation Encompass Drop In Session For Parents And Carers From 3:00pm Front Street Primary School has been taking part in a Home Office approved project being led by Northumbria Police, in partnership with Barnados and Operation Encompass.

The project named Operation Encompass, The Next Steps, aims to form part of a wider strategy to break the cycle of Domestic Abuse through education and support.

The project helps students learn the importance of friendships, relationships, emotions and rules so they can live and work together safely.

Our school also benefits from having a School Safeguarding Liaison Officer, Nicola Joicey, who has begun to deliver age appropriate material on domestic abuse, friendships, relationships and emotions.

She is also available in school for a drop-in session so that parents can talk about issues they may have around relationships and domestic abuse.

Our drop-in session will be held in school from 3pm on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> November. If you would like to take advantage of this, please report to the Office from 3:00pm where a member of staff will show you to the designated room. This will be done with as much confidentiality as possible.

## Switch Off Fortnight

We are taking part in the Pod's Switch Off Fortnight campaign starting on November  $18^{th}$ . More than 1,500 schools across the UK (and beyond) are joining in to take action and to change the way they use energy.

Over the fortnight, our pupils will explore different energy sources and learn about the actions we can all take to use this important resource in a way that minimises the impact on the environment. On a practical level, pupils will focus on saving energy at school by running an energy audit and identifying where energy is wasted. All the activities are designed to get young people to think about the ways they use energy, as well as sparking an early interest in science and engineering. The main aim of Switch Off Fortnight is to inspire long-term behaviour change and to help people understand the actions they can take to use energy efficiently.

Dear Mrs Gladstone.

I would like to congratulate you, your staff and your pupils on your school's outstanding achievements in the 2019 phonics screening check. Your excellent teaching of phonics is something I hope to see replicated across the country: decoding skills are the foundations for pupils to progress to reading fluently, for purpose and for enjoyment.

There is a substantial body of evidence that demonstrates that systematic phonics is a highly effective method for teaching children to read. We want to ensure that every child develops a firm grasp of phonics, which is why I was delighted to see your results. With 97 per cent of pupils at Front Street Community Primary School reaching or exceeding the pass mark in the check, your school is in the top five per cent of all primary schools in the country.

This year's figures show that 88 per cent of pupils who achieve the expected standard in the check go on to achieve at least the expected standard in key stage 1 reading teacher assessment, which underlines the importance of teaching pupils to decode words effectively at an early age.

Your success in teaching phonics and early reading so effectively means your pupils are developing a firm foundation in literacy, from which they can develop excellent vocabulary and cultivate a love of reading that can last a lifetime.

Thank you for your commitment and success in teaching the next generation to read so effectively.
